TO THE HEROES OF GROUND ZERO

Memorial — Steel beams from Tower 2 of the World Trade Center form a memorial sculpture dedicated at Lawrence Woodmere Academy. It honors victims of the 9/11 terrorist attack, including Port Authority head Neil Levin, a 1972 graduate of the school. Speakers were (right to left) Zara Zimmerman, LWA senior, who got Mayor Bloomberg's permission to remove the beams, Headmaster Dennis R. Carroll, and Ronald Prioleau, VP of the Student Senate.

LWA honored and remembered all victims of the 9/11 terrorist attacks with a memorial assembly on the front lawn of the school. Each year, students gather at the memorial plaque and sculpture, made from steel beams from Tower 2 of the World Trade Center, to remember and reflect. We will never forget.

FRIDAY FORUM & MID-AUTUMN FESTIVAL

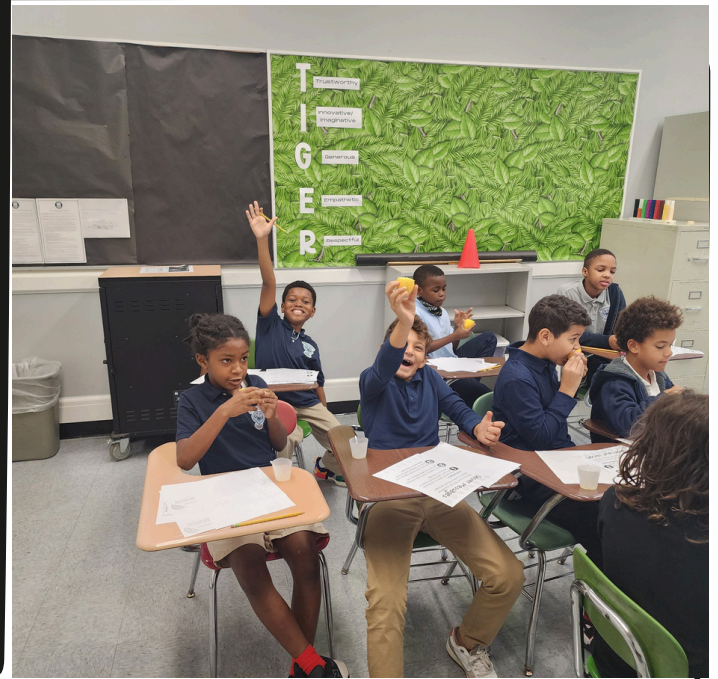

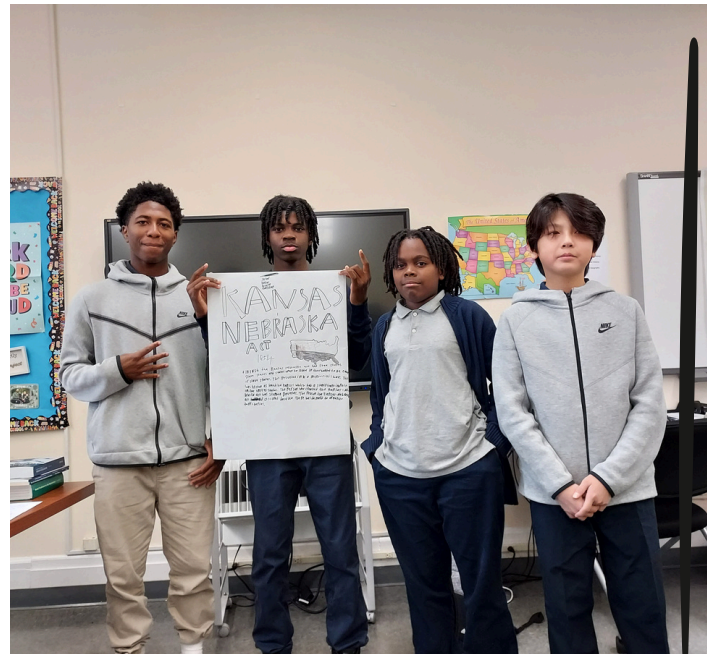

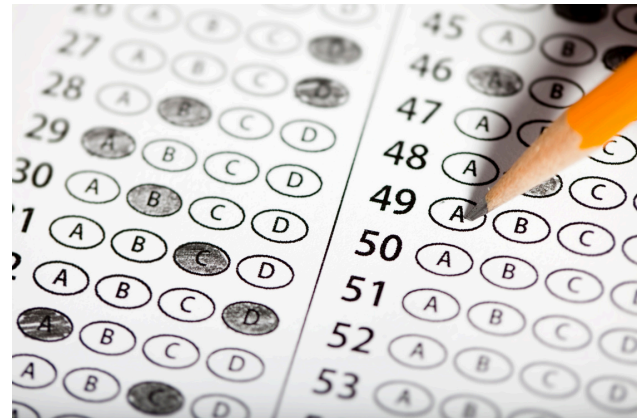


ANNOUNCEMENTS & REMINDERS
