#### The Miracles of Human Language

A profound reflection of human creativity, with over 7,000 spoken globally, languages showcase unique phonetic qualities, vocabulary varieties, and grammatical structures that highlight the versatility of verbal and nonverbal communication around the world.

The Miracles of Human Language is an introductory course that examines what is language and introduces phonetics, phonology, morphology, syntax, semantics, and language acquisition among other aspects of linguistic studies.

A rich tapestry of human history and social dynamics is seen in languages we use that can shape our perception and cognition, underscoring the intricate relationship between a word and thought.

In the month of October, the students collaborated on four group presentations on various topics in historical and applied linguistics, as well as psycho- and sociolinguistics. The last week of October was filled with sharing gathered information and ideas, exchanging viewpoints and questions, learning to maintain interest and engagement of the audience in many ways, making it a memorable experience for all involved.

It's our hope that the knowledge that students are acquiring through this course will give them new tools and perspectives on language learning and enhance their appreciation of English.




#### Clubs




